LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL CODE OF ETHICS

To organize, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.

To coordinate the activities and standardise the administration of Lions clubs.

To create and foster a spirit of understanding among the people of the world.

To promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.

To fund and otherwise serve the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

To assist financially, culturally, socially, and morally the disabled, disadvantaged and infirm of the community both directly and also indirectly.

To unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

To provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

To encourage service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavours.

CABINET TREASURER

MD201 COVID 19 HARDSHIP FUND

The Multiple District Council wished to provide some limited support to assist clubs that may have difficulty meeting their Multiple District dues for the first semi-annual payment. \$100,000 has been allocated to the Fund for members who are in genuine need of assistance in paying their Dues. If the fund is oversubscribed, successful clubs will receive a reduced proportion of the total amount applied for.

Procedure:

1. Clubs wishing to receive support from the Hardship Fund should e-mail their application to DG Narelle Parkins, DG.Q1@lions.org.au, no later than close of business, Wednesday 19th August 2020, to allow time for applications endorsed and sent to the MD Office by 21 August 2020.
2. The application must be accompanied by:
 - a. The completed application form already sent to all clubs in the district, or contact Cabinet Treasurer Libby Whitestyles Cabtreas.Q1@lions.org.au
 - b. A copy of the most recent audited accounts of the club.
 - c. A copy of the June 2020 bank statement for the Club's administrative account.
3. The amount claimed must not exceed the total amount for MD201 dues for the club, exclusive of insurance and other levies. That is, it may not exceed \$22.70 per certified member as at 30 June 2020.
4. Electronic receipt of applications and documents is preferred.
5. Subject to DG Narelle's endorsement of need, Council will consider applications at its meeting in September 2020.
6. If the grant is approved, those funds will be transferred to the District.
7. The District Treasurer will issue an amended invoice to the club, discounted by the amount of the grant. Note that the grant will not be paid to the club. The club will be required to pay the amended, discounted invoice to the District, and the District will pay the full invoice to MD201.

ZONE CHAIRPERSON CO-ORDINATOR ROLE

The role of the Zone Chairperson Co-ordinator was introduced some nine years ago to provide support for the Zone Chairs as most of them would be new to Cabinet and their role. The role of Coordinator is to get the Zone Chairs to work as a team and to involve, co-ordinate, advise, liaise and assist them to become knowledgeable and be able to support the smooth running of clubs in their zones.

Most Zone Chairpersons come into this role from being a Club President or Secretary and, as it is their first time on a Lions District Cabinet, things are always a bit strange and new. Apart from a few hours of training at District level to begin with, most Zone Chairpersons have very little experience in what they are to do. As Zone Co-ordinator my role is to be a place where they can seek information and support between Cabinet meetings and advising them of events coming up at District,

Multiple District and International levels, prompting them on what is required for club visits, zone meetings, outstanding monthly reports, where to go to for knowledge and guidance, ongoing training and advising them about the District Governor wishes for their year.

As the Zone Chairperson Co-ordinator is the eyes and ears for the District Governor and Cabinet Secretary, regular contact with Zone Chairpersons is a must, so by keeping the communication lines open, matters arising from clubs can be dealt with quickly and the smooth running of the clubs in the district can be upheld. The role also requires assisting them in all matters relating to membership, retention and ongoing leadership.

LIONS HAVEN FOR THE AGED & LIONS MEMORIAL WALL

Lions Haven for the Aged

Lions Haven for the Aged, located at Hope Island provides quality, comfortable and secure Aged Care in the Norther Gold Coast area.

Past District Governor, Lion Bob Hopgood and his wife Lion Shirley, who are both life members of Runaway Bay Lions Club, have lived at Lions Haven for the past 4 years and consider it their home away from home.

Lion Bob, who is a Charter Member of Runaway Bay Lions, provided some interesting historical information about Lions Haven and how it came to be.

In the late 1980's, 10 Lions Clubs on the Gold Coast banded together and bought 5 acres of what was then swamp land that needed to be built up before any construction could commence. At the time Lion Bob was President of Runaway Bay Lions Club.

Past District Governor Brian Gent assembled a committee to oversee the project which was to build a retirement village for over 50's. The swamp land was raised by over 2 metre with fill and then left to settle for 12 months before cutting back to one metre above the road level. Once the site was approved by the local council, 3 wards and an administration block were built, with Lions Haven for the Aged officially opening in 1992.

In 2015 a further exciting advancement was the opening of a new double storey wing providing another 54 new beds to add to the existing 67 beds that delivers a high standard of Low Care, Ageing in Place, High Care and Respite, and Dementia specific care, working closely with the local community to deliver the best possible care in the region.

Lions Haven is a fully accredited Aged Care facility, that has built a name in the region as being very comfortable, with high clinical standards, whilst adopting a warm and friendly atmosphere. It is a past recipient of an Excellence in Care Award from Aged Care Queensland.



Most of the Lions Clubs in the Gold Coast region continue involvement in Lions Haven through the provision of members to the Board that guides the facility.

This memorial wall recognises and applauds the community service of those Lions members that have passed. Runaway Bay Lions are honoured to be entrusted with the custodianship of this memorial wall.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS – MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES



Did you know that there is more than one category of membership in our Lions organization? Most of us are what is known as “active” members and we usually don’t think about the other categories.

For the information of newer Lions members and as a reminder to longer-serving members, there is actually a total of 7 membership categories available. Each of these categories has differences in some way from the others, especially in relation to fees payable or voting privileges but all permit participation in club activities.

The seven membership categories are: Active; Affiliate; Associate; Honorary, Life, Member at Large; and Privileged. A club’s board is responsible for determining the category into which each club member is placed, either by changing a category during a member’s ongoing membership or when a person first is invited to join.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS – 2020 DISTRICT CONVENTION

This year’s annual district convention will be held on the first week-end in November (Friday 6th to Sunday 8th). It is a constitutional requirement that this occurs and, accordingly, the Convention Organising Committee is actively planning to hold the convention at SunPac Theatre, 470 McCullough Street, Sunnybank (adjacent to the Sunnybank Community Sports Club).

As is well known to all of us, the presence of the Covid 19 virus has forced the Government to place limitations on the size of gatherings and on venue capacities as well as people from overseas and interstate entering Queensland. The District Executive and the Convention Organising Committee are very mindful of the implications of these restrictions on the holding of this year’s convention.

When Cabinet Secretary Di McCrae calls for nominations for the positions of District Governor, 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors, motions for placement before the convention, and for a convention host club for the 2022 convention, clubs are informed that the closing dates for each

of these calls are to be observed. All delegates’ and alternates’ forms should also be returned by the stipulated date.

Should a “personally attended” convention not be able to be held because of future or extended Covid 19 restrictions being imposed, the DG and VDG elections and the voting on any motions received must still go ahead within some revised format. Your District Executive is currently working on how this would occur. Full advice with as much notice as future circumstances will permit will be given should this eventuality need to happen.


