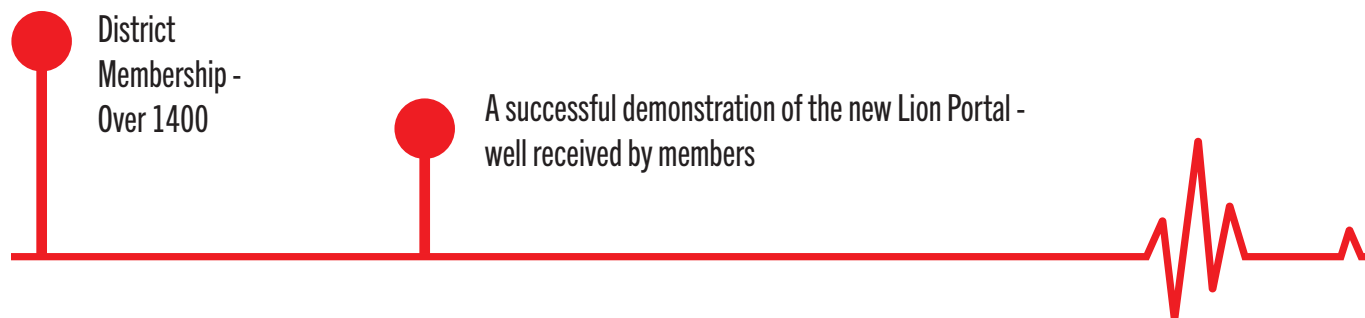
"Make your Mark"

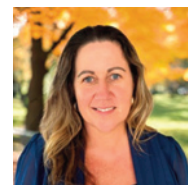

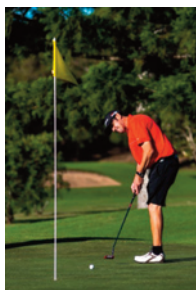

Five clubs in our District have so far indicated their intention to participate in the Peace Poster competition. It is not too late for your club to join this iconic Lions project that promotes the cause of peace around the world. Not only peace from bombs and missiles but also peace in local communities and extends to an individuals inner peace.

Sound out your local primary and secondary schools, Scouts, Guides and other organised youth groups for their interest. Should a group be interested the club needs to order a Peace Contest Kit from the Lions store (\$25.00 plus postage). Cut off date for purchasing kits for the 2024/25 contest is October 1.

All entries are submitted to your Lions club for judging and the winning entry from the club must be sent to the District Peace Poster chair by November 15.

A certificate for the club winner is in the kit and an email copy of a participation certificate can be provided for all students who entered the contest.

The MD winners in the Peace Poster and Peace Essay contests each receive a plaque and \$200.00 cheque which will be presented at the MD convention each year.

Lap the Map was an event historically created by Lions Australia to help raise awareness for diabetes, where participants would collectively hike the distance equivalent to the circumference of Australia, which is 25,760kms, as many times as they could.

This year, Australian Lions Hearing Dogs are taking the lead.

Diabetes is a chronic disease where the body either cannot produce insulin, sufficient insulin, or is not able to effectively use the insulin it can produce, resulting in varying glucose levels in the blood that can cause long-term health complications. More than 1.3 million Australians lived with diabetes in 2021, with the disease contributing to 11% of all deaths in 2022.

For Lap the Map this 2024, we want to invite Lions Clubs, community groups and individuals of all ages,

abilities, and backgrounds to join us. This event can be a great opportunity to get moving in wherever or whichever way you enjoy – whether it's walking, running, riding, swimming or many more! – all while helping Australian Lions Hearing Dogs share and raise awareness of the disease. Each dollar we raise through Lap the Map will support our Medical Alert Dog program to ensure we can continue to provide Diabetic Alert Dogs free of charge to Australians in need.

Lions Cakes – Gluten Free

Lions Cakes – **GLUTEN FREE** cakes now available

Some Lions and their family members will be pleased to know that Gluten Free cakes are about to be available from Traditional Foods. Availability is expected from early September.

The gluten free cake will be plain wrapped and will not have any Lions details and therefore will not be subject to LCI or MD duties nor will the number sold be added to District sales. Clubs must not put any Lions logo or details on packaging.

The shelf life of these cakes is 12 months from production (August / September 2025).

The cake will be 400g, round and will have a sticker/label with all the required health information.

The cost of a carton of 10 cakes is \$55, with the cakes selling for \$10 each.



Orders must be in cartons of **three or mixed** with a club's normal order.

This is a TRIAL ONLY and we will see how sales go over the next couple of seasons before proceeding with a Lions Gluten Free cake but this should help Clubs that have customers asking for this product.

A copy of the order form should be available on the Lions Australia website soon, but a form is attached for your convenience.

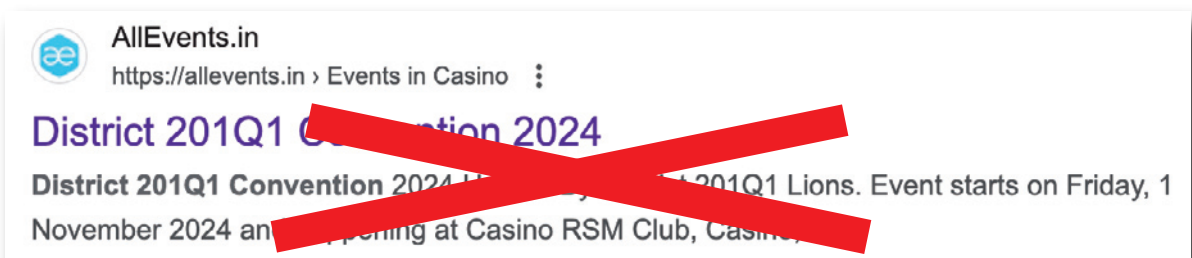
