## Treasurer Matters



### Income Tax Exemption Self-Assessment Changes

- All not-for-profit (NFP) organisations that have an ABN and are not registered with the ACNC have to lodge an annual return with the ATO to confirm they are self-assessing as income tax exempt.
- The first return is for the 2023-2024 year, and is due for lodgement between 1 July and 31 October 2024. However, the ATO will allow an extension to 31 March 2025 to lodge this first return.
- These changes apply to all NFP's with an ABN and who are not registered with the ACNC, regardless of their turnover.
- These changes also have no bearing on whether a club is required to be audited. The requirement for an audit will be determined by a club's constitution and the association laws in the relevant state.

### myGovID is changing to myID

Soon, the Australian Government's Digital ID app, myGovID, will be changing its name to myID. This is due to the confusion between myGovID (a person's digital identity with the government, using a smart

phone app) and myGov (a person's online account with the government, which you access for various government services such as lodging your tax return).

After the name change, you'll still have:

- your same details: don't set up a new myID, your login details (including email address) and identity strength remains the same.
- continued use: your app should automatically update to myID or you can manually update it from the App Store or Google Play once it's available.
- access to services: you can still use the app to securely access a range of government online services.

- experience at being interviewed (as for a job) in a non-threatening environment
- opportunities to meet and interact with other like minded students
- worthwhile additions to their CVs
- attractive rewards at Club and State level

Entry is open to any Australian youth who is attending, or has attended, a high school or other secondary school or equivalent in the Lions year (July to June) in which the National Final is to be conducted. This includes first year tertiary study students who were engaged in secondary education for part of the relevant Lions year. Students must also have attained the age of 15 and be under the age of 19 years as of 30th of June in that same year.

## Child Safety



### INCIDENT REPORTING & MANAGEMENT

If a Lions Club is engaged in activities involving children or young people, members need to understand that they have a responsibility to comply with all relevant requirements of the Child Safe Policy which includes acting on any allegations of abuse or suspicions of harm. (Abuse can be defined as sexual, physical, emotional abuse or negligence)

### Who Reports Abuse

A member may become aware of an allegation or incident of abuse by numerous means such as observation, face-to-face, telephone, social media, text etc.

It is the responsibility of all Lions Australia Club members to report abuse if they:

- Witnessed the alleged abuse.
- Were informed of the alleged abuse by another member and it had not been reported.
- Were informed of the alleged abuse by the child or young person who was the victim.
- Were informed of the alleged abuse by a child or young person who was not the victim.
- Were informed of the alleged abuse by a non-member of Lions Australia.



All immediate safety concerns are to be reported to the Police by any Lions member as a matter of priority.

When an allegation is received or incident happens and where immediate safety of the young person has been assured, the Child Safe Procedure should be activated by the Club's Child Safe Officer and/or the Program leader and a **Child Safe Incident Report Form** completed. If a District activity, then the District CSO or District Program chair would action the process. The Multiple District Child Safe Officer (PDG Donna Hedges) should be contacted and informed of the allegation/incident. The Child Safe Incident Report form is available on the Lions Australia website under the Child Safe Policy section.

### What Needs to be Reported?

If you are the person to whom the allegations have been disclosed or you have been made aware of the allegation, it is critical you **do not** excessively question the child or young person.

Interviewing is for the purpose of understanding the nature of the allegation and ensuring safety.



## Child Safety

Excessive interviewing can be traumatic for a victim and may inadvertently compromise the evidence and any further evidence may be deemed inadmissible in a court due to perceived coaching or rehearsing.

All pertinent conversations with the child or young person and relevant other parties need to be documented in an impartial manner and with reference to as many direct quotes as possible. Good documentation helps prevent the child from having to repeat the story.

Once a child or young person has made a disclosure keep them safe and reassure them they have done the right thing in disclosing and that any allegations of abuse are not their fault.

Please Note: So long as a report has been made in good faith, legislation in all states and territories protects reporters, therefore no criminal, civil or administrative proceedings can be brought against them.

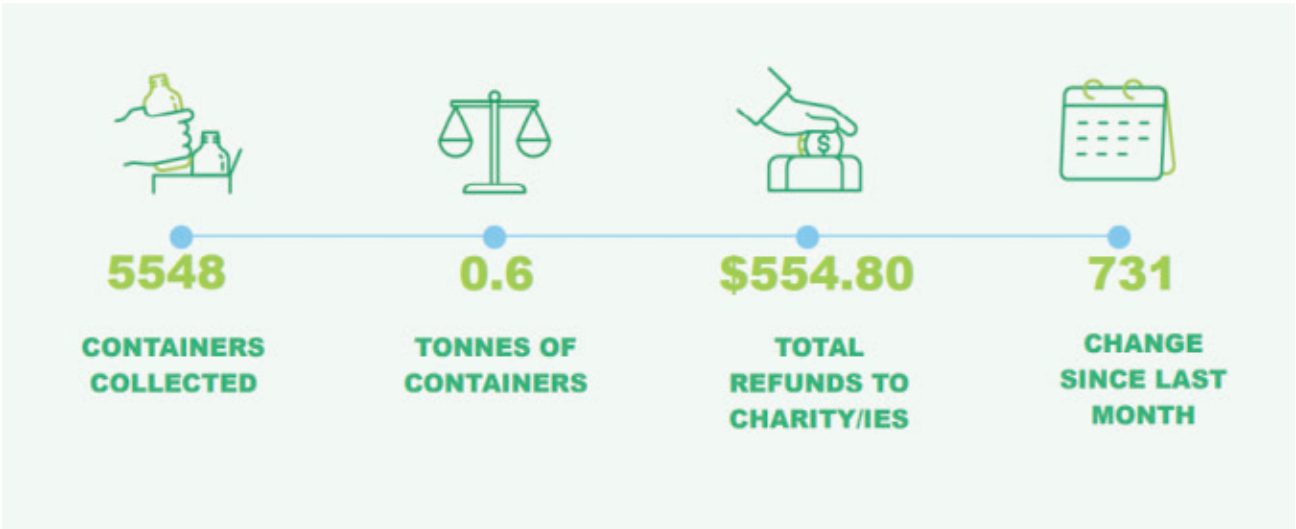

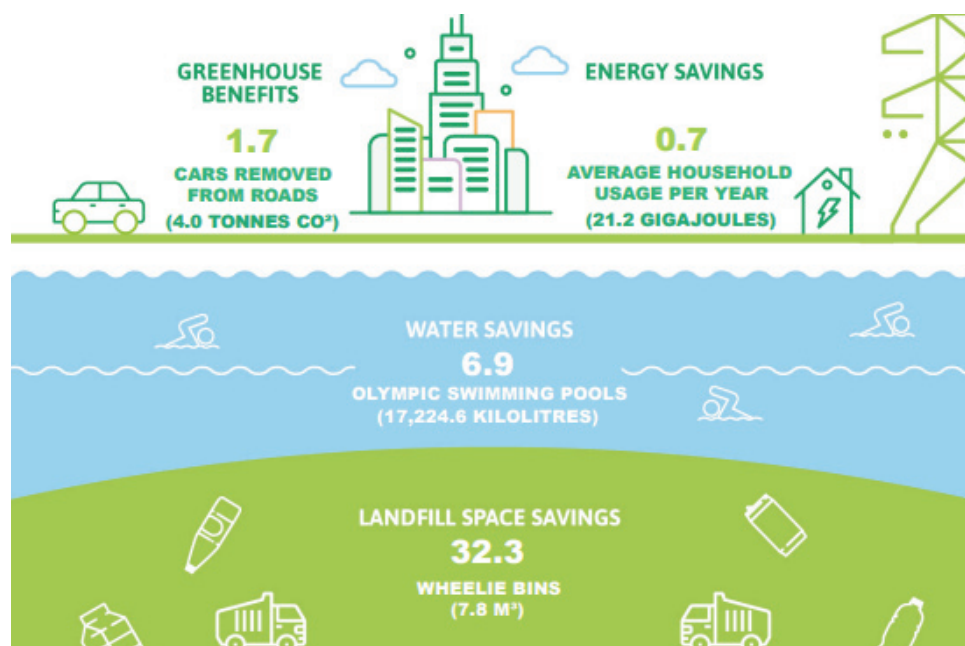

## Club Activities

### Lions Club of Greater Mount Gravatt Mansfield



*Every Monday Lions Lynn and Barbara jump in the utility at Southside Community Care Inc (SSCI), Upper Mount Gravatt, and take a drive to Second Bite at Murrarie. They have an appointment at 10.30am to collect fruit, vegetables, dairy products, and groceries for the food parcels provided weekly by SSCI for their clients.*

*They unload the perishables into a refrigerator (soon to be a cold store).*

*Tuesday mornings, Lions Peter and Iain divide the fruit and vegetables into 18 shopping bags, pack two big cooler boxes with refrigerated goods and load them into the utility to deliver to the SSCI homes. They also deliver bread donated by a bakery. Lions have been on this roster for five years.*

*Southside Community Care provide housing on the southside of Brisbane for families and single older women who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. There are 18 residences where clients are placed temporarily while awaiting permanent accommodation in private or public housing rentals.*

*The clients come from a variety of situations including escaping domestic violence or maybe refugees. Clients are assisted by family workers to access accommodation, assistance in attending court, whatever help is needed to achieve a stable life.*

*Thus, this project enables the Lions Club of Greater Mount Gravatt Mansfield to achieve two aims of serving our local community and meeting Lions Clubs International Global Cause of Hunger.*

*Our members who volunteer for these projects report satisfaction from providing a practical service to those in need in our community.*

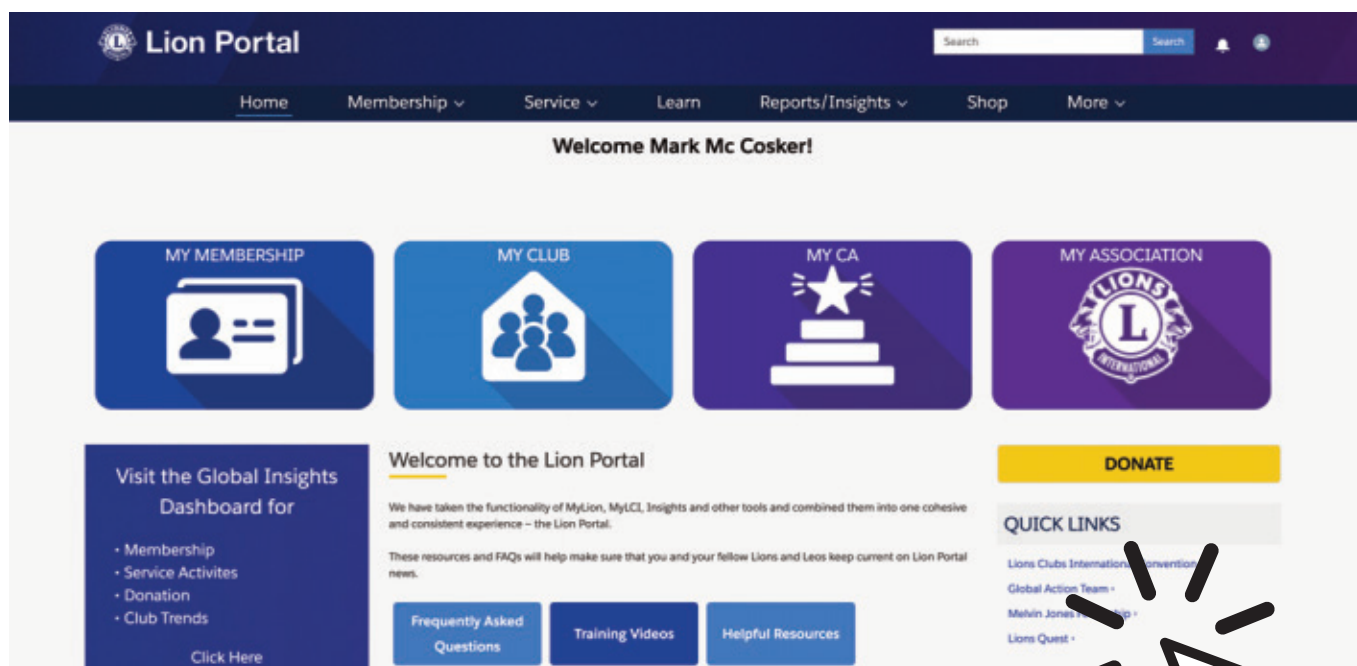
