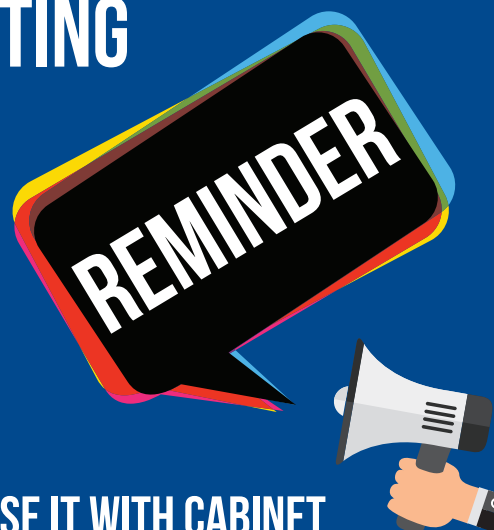

Facebook Page Suspension Update

✨ Exciting news ✨

Lions International has released information in regard to the recent suspension of Lions Facebook pages.

Lions can now request to protect their account's use of Lions Clubs International branding with Meta Brand Rights Protection. This tool allows our official Facebook account to identify Lions clubs' Facebook accounts using official branding and allow these accounts to use the content.

Facebook page admins can request protection for their Lions club's Facebook page by filling out an easy form

The form is super easy, all you need is your Lions Club Facebook URL link, club name, district, your name and email address!

Please note that this doesn't mean you will get your old Facebook account back unfortunately, however Lions International have included some suggestions for your club to try and reinstate your account.

To prevent future account suspension, Lions should:

- ◆ Add multiple admins to the club page.
- ◆ Ensure all page admins have active accounts
- ◆ Ensure all page admins follow Facebook Community Standards
- ◆ Regularly engage with other accounts.
- ◆ Moderate content to align with Facebook policies
- ◆ Subscribe to Meta verified for proactive account protection

Did you know 3.5 million Australians aged 15 and over, which represents 22% of its population, have mild to severe hearing issues?

Hearing Awareness Week runs from March 1 to 7 and is an annual event that highlights the issues affecting Australians living with hearing loss. This week is a vital part of the ongoing effort to improve the challenges people with hearing loss face on a daily basis, shedding light on the significance of hearing health, promoting early detection, and encouraging solutions that improve the lives of individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing.

One of Lions major project to support this cause is Australians Lions Hearing Dogs, which was

established when PDG Bob Allen and PDG Brian Carter introduced the concept after a trip to a Lions Convention in the United States back in 1980.

Australian Lions Hearing Dogs is a not-for-profit organisation that aims to provide Hearing Assistance Dogs to Australians who are deaf or hard of hearing at no cost. Each Assistance Dog amount to an approximate cost of \$40,000, thus our success is only made possible through the collective efforts of our supporters and the Lions Club of Australia.

This Hearing Awareness Week let's make it our mission to make ear and health care a reality for all and remember the incredible impact that our Lions Hearing Dogs have on the lives of Deaf and hard of hearing Australians.

And now for something special.

The Order of Australia Medal is the highest recognition within the Australian honours system for outstanding achievement and service. It has four levels:

- 1. Companion of Order of Australia (AC)*
- 2. Officer of Order of Australia (AO)*
- 3. Member of Order of Australia (AM) and*
- 4. Medal of THE Order (OAM)*

This morning, January 26th 2025, as part of the Australia Day Honours, Kyogle's very own Lion Roz Knights was announced as a recipient of an OAM in the General Division for her ongoing service to the Kyogle community.

Since 2014 Roz has been the manager of the Kyogle Lions Community Foodpantry, which under Roz's leadership and management has grown to be the largest and most successful enterprise of it's type in the Northern Rivers Region and possibly even a large part of the State on NSW. Roz is also involved in a number of other community initiatives including Kyogle's Emergency Red Cross Disaster Committee and Community Resilience Team and was a former Volunteer at the Kyogle Evacuation Centre. Roz works tirelessly and closely with other Kyogle support agencies to help meet the needs of the wider Kyogle Community.

Ros was also awarded an Honesty, Empathy, Respect and Trust Award, by Lions Australia, District Q1, in 2022, and was the Kyogle Citizen of the Year, in 2017.

At our November meeting, we had the pleasure of welcoming guest speaker Tyce, who took part in New Hope Cambodia's volunteer trip in partnership with students from The Industry School - Redlands during the September/October 2024 school holidays, helping support local communities.

Our connection with Tyce began earlier this year when we met his parents at our monthly market in Redland Bay. This led to Tyce and one of his parents joining us at a meeting, where he shared his inspiring journey. His participation in the New Hope Cambodia trip was made possible through his own fundraising efforts and the generous support of local community groups, including our Lions Club.

In a wonderful show of gratitude and community spirit, Tyce offered to help at one of our upcoming markets. We enjoyed hearing about his experience in Cambodia.

In his own words, this is an overview of his trip.

Worked to construct a large house for a family of 5 out of sturdy wood frames and a raised concrete base to avoid flood damage. By painting and sanding rough edges constructing studs that fit wall dimensions with limited tools, hung weatherboarding

around the entire house for a cool waterproof finish, then worked on the school renovating a non-usable room to an enjoyable space with new sanded drywall and paint to become a library for the school kids, then pressure-washed the concrete pathways around the school from its moss and grime, then sanding and repainted a large faded school seating lunch area cover, which was necessary as the rain is very heavy and general maintenance

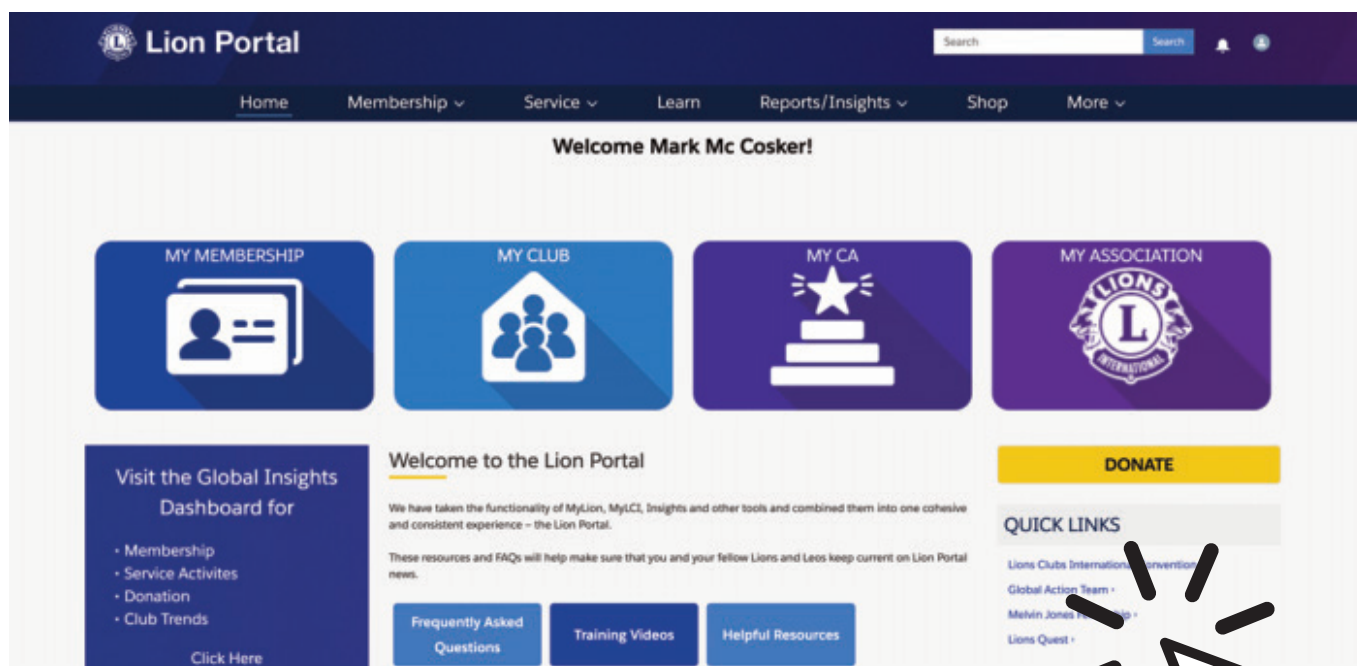
